MICHAEL KAY *finds a new definition of luxury*
on board the FAIRLINE SQUADRON 65.

We see them in the grand and romantic endings of Hollywood movies, in opulent adverts coasting around the south of France, and on sunny Sunday afternoons basking in the Clifton sunshine, but when the Fairline Squadron 65 ported in Cape Town, Cirque Magazine saw it up close and personal.

On her journey to her new home in Angola, the yacht made a stop in Cape Town before cruising up the coastline of Africa. While she was in harbour, I chatted to Derrick Levy, head of the Boating World team who sold her to her new owners, and whose family is now going into its fourth generation in this fascinating niche arena.

Derrick is a boat man through and through; it's both his job and his vocation. Sitting at the magnificent One & Only Hotel with him, gazing at the yacht sitting quietly on the water in all

her glory, I can tell this is a man who is passionate about boats and the ocean. His eyes light up discussing the yacht and he happily reminisces about how his father would take him out on the ocean from an early age – and continues to do so today.

The world of boating is as much a part of Derrick's DNA as the finest materials are part of a Fairline luxury yacht's construction. When I ask him what he loves most about the industry
